information between police Services. An electronic copy of the manual is available on the Training Bureau Departmental Page on the Peel Regional Police (P.R.P.) IntraNet;

- (I) "Case Manager" is an investigator meeting the requisite qualifications of the Ontario Major Case Management System and the Ontario Policing Standards;
- (m) "PowerCase" is a Province wide computer network utilizing common case management software. All Ontario Police Services must utilize this during the investigation of a major case. The network is capable of analyzing investigative "tombstone" data of a nature not presently captured on ViCLAS, in a central database. Investigators-in-Charge of major case investigations and the Serial and Predator Crime Unit Coordinator will be notified of any commonalties by way of an unsolicited system message;
- (n) "major case" is defined in the Ontario Major Case Management Manual as:
  - (i) homicides within the meaning of subsection 222.(4) of the Criminal Code of Canada and attempted homicides;
  - (ii) sexual assaults, including sexual interference, and attempted sexual assaults, sexual exploitation and invitation to sexual touching:
  - (iii) non-familial abductions and attempted non-familial abductions;
  - (iv) missing person Occurrences where circumstances indicate a strong possibility of foul play;
  - (v) Occurrences, involving found human remains, that are suspected to be homicide;
  - (vi) criminal harassment where the harasser is not known to the victim; and,
  - (vii) any other types of cases designated as a major case pursuant to the Ontario Major Case Management Manual; and,
- (o) "Joint Force Operation" is a planned operation supported by written agreement involving two (2) or more police Services with common objectives related to the investigation of multi-jurisdictional criminal activity.

Note: The definition of "Joint Force Operation" does not include situations where one police Service requests assistance from another police Service with an investigation or specific criminal Occurrence.

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## D. Responsibilities

- Section 11 of Ontario Regulation 3/99 under the Police Services Act (Adequacy and Effectiveness of Police Services) directs every Chief of Police to prepare and maintain a <u>Criminal Investigation Management Plan</u>. The Officer-in-Charge (O.I.C.), Operations Support Services shall be responsible for the annual review of the <u>Criminal Investigation Management Plan</u>.
