- 2. The criminal investigation function:
 - (a) provides resources relating to the detection, suppression and investigation of criminal acts, and selected Provincial Statutes:
 - (b) is structured to identify criminal trends in a timely manner and to activate a pro-active tactical strategy to apprehend criminals and disrupt criminal activity;
 - (c) provides services related to young offenders, children in need of protection and missing persons; and,
 - (d) includes crime prevention, and high risk offenders and Provincial parolee monitoring.

F. <u>Divisional Criminal Investigation Bureaux</u>

- 1. The O.I.C., C.I.B. shall be responsible for the planning, organizing, coordinating and controlling of bureau activities and programs, in order to achieve annual goals and objectives.
- 2. A Divisional C.I.B. is located at each of the Divisions and acts as a general investigative unit mandated to investigate criminal matters, except those allocated to Operation Support Services and the Uniform Bureaux.
- 3. Divisional C.I.B. personnel shall be responsible for conducting the following types of investigations:
 - (a) attempt murders;
 - (b) suicides, death of a child under the age of eighteen (18) and suspicious deaths and circumstances;
 - (c) death where an inquest is to be called;
 - (d) crime involving the use of firearms and offensive weapons;
 - (e) serious assaults;
 - (f) criminal harassment:
 - (g) arson;
 - (h) thefts (including vehicles);
 - (i) robberies that do not fall under the mandate of the Central Robbery Bureau, as outlined in section G.1.(c) of this directive:
 - (j) break and enters:
 - (k) mischief;
 - bomb threats:
 - (m) missing persons;
