

**REPORT OF A DISCIPLINE OFFENCE TO

**SUMMARY OF OFFENCE:**

Constable [redacted], a member of the Peel Regional Police, assisted a women off duty in recovering some property from the residence she formerly shared with her estranged husband. When Constable [redacted] reported on duty, he saw a call for service at that address involving a suspicious person. Constable [redacted] attended the call. When the complainant discovered that it had been Constable [redacted] who had been at the residence before, he became upset and initiated a public complaint.

The matter was adjudicated. Constable [redacted] actions in involving himself in a matter on duty in which he had taken action off duty, was found to be misconduct, but not of a serious nature. The complainant appealed the decision to the Ontario Civilian Commission on Police Services. The Commission found that Constable [redacted] actions may constitute misconduct of a serious nature and ordered that a hearing be held.

**DISPOSITION:**

Reprimand.
