## **SUMMARY OF OFFENCE:**

## Count 1

On July 29<sup>th</sup>, 2005 Constable \_\_\_\_\_, a member of the Peel Regional Police, was on duty when he directed other officers to arrest a Young Offender for the criminal offence of Uttering Threats. The Young Offender was later released on a Form 10 and Form 11.1 with a court appearance date of August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2005.

Constable was the officer-in-charge of the case and was responsible for ensuring the crown folder was completed properly and submitted to his supervisor in a timely manner. Constable circumvented the process and on August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2005 he handed the incomplete crown folder to the Assistant Crown Attorney.

Constable \_ was negligent in the performance of his duties.

## Count 2

On August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2005 Constable \_\_\_\_ a member of the Peel Regional Police, was "off duty" when he submitted a crown folder to the courts on the arrest of a Young Offender who was scheduled to appear in court that day.

Constable was deceptive in that he forged the signature of his supervisor on the Crown Envelope and on two copies of the Crown Brief Index Form. When confronted with the deficiencies in the late submission of the Crown envelope Constable continued with his deceptiveness to court staff and investigators.

Constable actions in attempting to cover up his negligence were discreditable in nature.
